

Facts and Figures

Orgryte Idrottssallskap (OIS) Sweden was founded in 1887 and is one of the oldest and most famous sports clubs in the country. Orgryte is several times winners of the Swedish League.

The team is the most popular in Sweden at present if popularity can be calculated from gate drawings. During the last six years, Orgryte is the leading club as regards spectators in the whole of Sweden, and have the record for the country with a gate attendance of 52,178 spectators at a single League game.

Many Internationally well-known players, such as Gunnar Gren, Sven Rydell, Sven Friberg, Eric Borjesson, Ivar Klingstrom, Robert Zander, and several others, have been associated with the club. In the present team all players have turned out in International games for Sweden in the various competitions.

Orgryte is world known and nas taken part in International matches in Denmark, Norway, Finland, England, Germany, Austria, Italy, Spain, Holland, Belgium, and Poland, as well as Scotland, where at one time Orgryte played against Hibs at Easter Road.


The team plays on the new stadium of Gothenburg, which was officially opened in 1958. The stadium has a capacity of 53,000 spectators. Designed primarily for sporting events, sports fans have witnessed football, athletics, speedway racing, ice hockey, and skating at the stadium.

On 20th October Dunfermline will be visiting Gothenburg to play the second leg of the first round tie. Already vice-chairman, Mr. R. Torrie, and the Dunfermline manager, Mr. William Cunningham, have visited the stadium.

The officials of the Gothenburg club extend a welcome to the Dunfermline officials, players and visiting party for the second leg of the tie and offer the hospitality of the "most attractive city" of Gothenburg.

HALF-BACKS:


- ANDERS SVENSSON—A television technician and an "A" Class International. Joined Orgryte from P.S.V. Eindhoven in 1963.

- LARS OLOFSSON—A strong tackling, hard shooting player and has played in Swedish junior and "B" International teams. An electrician, he joined Orgryte in 1957.

FORWARDS:

- JENS SODERBERG—A newcomer to the side and formerly played for IF Elfsborg, Boras. A "B" Class International and an economics student.
- ROGER KARLSON—Has played a number of International games in Swedish junior football and is a product of the Orgryte school. A clerk by profession.
- AGNE SIMONSSON—Formerly a professional with Real Madrid and an "A" Class International player. Another product of the Orgryte school.
- RUNE BORJESSON—The top-scorer in Swedish League football. Has graduated from the O.I.S. school. Is an agricultural student and previously played for Palermo F.C.
- ORJAN PERSSON—The star player in the side. Has been with the club since 1961 and is an engineer. Just 22 years of age.
- ROLF HANSSON—An all-round player who can play in a number of positions. Joined the club in 1962 and is a bank official.

MORE ABOUT ORGRYTE
